


TEACHERS' BOOTCAMP: STRENGTHENING CHILD-CENTERED EDUCATION

Social Lab Nepal hosted a Teachers' Bootcamp on February 17 at Barahi Heritage, Godawari, bringing together educators from three public schools; Shree Saraswoti Basic School, Shree Saatkanya Basic School, and Shree Deurali Basic School.

A total of 27 teachers participated in the program, facilitated by Manosparsha.



What We Focused On

Child Rights & Value-Based Education

- Teachers explored how to integrate child rights, safeguarding, and moral values into classroom practices.

Empathy-Driven Pedagogy

- Sessions emphasized understanding student emotions and behavior, and how empathy can transform teaching.



Positive Discipline & Conflict Resolution

- Practical role-plays and case studies helped teachers learn non-violent classroom management and constructive conflict resolution techniques.

Cross-School Exchange

- The bootcamp created space for teachers to reflect on their own practices, share experiences, and learn from peers across schools.
